Principal's Message

Year 12 2022 - Farewell and Thank You

Thank you for leading our community into a deeper appreciation of what it means to be committed to a life of love and service.

Community is the place of celebration, and next week we will gather to celebrate what and who we really are when we engage in rituals to farewell Year 12, 2022, at the conclusion of their 13 years of formal education.

On Tuesday evening, 20th September, members of Year 12 will gather with family members, staff members and guests to celebrate their Graduation Mass. On Wednesday morning, 21 September, 2022, they will gather again to celebrate their formal Graduation from our College. This will involve a Graduation Ceremony incorporating a Liturgy, Speeches and a presentation of Awards and Reports; a Year 12 "Special Assembly", morning tea and a "Clap-Out" by Year 7 to 11 Students and Staff.

A Eucharistic Celebration on Tuesday evening at 6.00pm in St Paul's Catholic Church, Gateshead, presided over by Fr Anthony Potts, PP, MacKillop Parish, is a most fitting farewell ritual. The word Eucharist means "giving thanks". As community members (parents, students and staff) we have so much to be truly thankful for.

It is a time to give thanks for the opportunity we have been given to become a Year 7-12 co-educational College and to be now preparing to celebrate the Graduation of our 4th HSC class.

It is a time to give thanks for the vision of the Sisters of St Joseph (Lochinvar) who toiled relentlessly and unstintingly to establish our community in 1964 and imbue it with a spirit of community – a spirit of love, justice, compassion, service, learning and hospitality. A spirit which defines St Mary's Gateshead as a Christ-centred place, a place where our mission is to give life to and receive life from others.

Through their 13 years of schooling, our Year 12 student have received life from so many good, caring and faith-filled people, especially from you their first educators – their parents, grandparents, and family members. MINISTRY – The Story of the Stoles

Today, I'd like to write to you about the Graduation Stoles that are bestowed on our Year 12 as they move onto their next stage of life. The word "stole" is taken from the Latin, which in turn is translated from the Greek. It means "robe".

For our graduating students it symbolises the completion of 13 years of education. So, our Year 12 2021, even though they leave to continue their journey of life, will always be members of the St. St Mary's Community and go into their future "Ready to Serve".

These Graduation Stoles that they take as a memento, are already serving the children who live in the Mukuru slum on the edge of Nairobi, Kenya. The purchase of these stoles funds the schooling, uniform and provision of a meal of a child for 12 months. The meal would be the only food that they will have that day. St Mary's has a commitment that our Graduation Class help disadvantaged children to be blessed with an education.



It would be worthwhile to share what I witnessed in the Mukuru slums. The African slums are nothing that we can imagine in Australia. Mukuru is 10km away from the Nairobi town centre. The slum was initially used as a dump, thus the name Mukuru which means 'garbage site'. The first thing that I experienced was the horrible sickly smell. Human waste is along each side of the pathway and seeps into the homes that are made of wood, metal, tree branches, cardboard, plastic and anything that will provide shelter. Open sewers run alongside the local schools. There is no such thing as a garbage collection, so the polluting rubbish is everywhere. Disease and poverty are rife. The average life expectancy is 30 years.

Like many slums in developing countries, Mukuru has to face many challenges including crime, drug abuse, prostitution and many other problems of subsistence. The people that I met in Mukuru showed immense courage and hope, self-pride and faith. They are meeting challenges and seeking improvement in their community.

Mukuru slum is home to about 700 000 people. The families there exist in one tiny, corrugated iron shack about 3m x 3m, generally with no flooring. Very few homes have electricity. Water is from a communal tap shared between hundreds and even thousands of others. There are some toilets, these are also communal. All these citizens have to pay the Government rent which is US \$12-25 per month depending on the position of the dwelling. There are some Government schools.

From the Christian perspective, the Catholic Church partly sponsors Our Lady of Nazareth Primary School while the Australian Christian Brothers under Br Frank O'Shea cfc, run the Ruben Centre where I spent most of my time. The Christian Brothers also have a Special School for disabled children. The Holy Ghost Fathers have some projects according to the needs of the people. The people have formed a group called the Mukuru Promotion Centre which seeks to better conditions to develop Education, Health and Social Development and Rehabilitation within the Mukuru community.

There is much more I can tell you about the immersion experience in which I was privileged to participate. The stoles that we use were originally made in the Ruben Centre by Mukuru. I am happy that St Mary's Year 12 are able to help a child survive for a year in circumstances that are poor and needy.

The life of the Christian is to love.

Year 11 Changes to Pattern of Study, Reports and Interviews

In Week 7 of this term an assembly for Year 11 students was held in relation to **changing patterns of study for HSC**. As students are completing their final tasks in their Year 11 Courses they are encouraged to discuss their progress with their teachers and to assess where changes to their pattern of study may be beneficial to them as they move into Year 12. I have spoken to students recently about the importance of not rushing their decision to "drop" a subject or change levels too early, encouraging students to think about maintaining all courses for the first term of Year 12 Course work (Term 4 2022). Students and their parents/carers will have the opportunity to meet with teachers in Week 4 Term 4 and this may be a good time to seek advice regarding any changes to courses. **There is no urgency to make a rushed decision.**

Students may also choose to pick up an additional unit of study at this point – **Mathematics Extension 2**, **English Extension 2 or Extension History**. To commence studying in one of these subjects, an interview must take place between the students and myself, and approval is required from both the subject teacher and relevant Leader of Learning. Please encourage your child to have this conversation as soon as possible if they are thinking of taking on an additional unit in these areas. Classes in these new subjects will commence next term, running offline – at a time arranged between students and teacher.

The process to make changes to a pattern of study, once Year 11 Courses are complete, is as follows:

- 1. Students discuss any changes with relevant subject teacher.
- 2. Students and Parent/Carer complete a 2022/2023 HSC Subject Change Form. See link:
 - HSC Course Changes Form.doc
- 3. Signatures of parents/carers, teachers and Leaders of Learning are required.
- 4. Subject Changes will not all be finalised until at least Week 1 of Term 4. Students cannot change patterns of study until all requests have been addressed, ATAR pathways are checked and then changes are made to the student's timetable on Compass.
- 5. Once the change appears on the student's Compass timetable, they may commence in the new class.

Year 11 Reports, Awards and Interviews

Student, Parent and Teacher Interviews have been scheduled for Week 3 Term 4. This time has been put aside for students and parents to follow up on Year 11 Course Reports as well as plan with teachers their future directions and goals for Year 12 studies. This time provides an opportunity for teachers to "feed forward" – establishing expectations for students as they move into their final HSC year. Details regarding the interviews will be conveyed next term, at the time of End of Course Reports being published via Compass. All students are encouraged to attend the interviews – allowing them to set realistic and aspirational goals for the next twelve months.

Year 11 Awards will be held on the same day as the Interviews, commencing at 2pm at the College. Further details to follow.

Year 10 (Year 11 2023) Subject Selections

I am currently still conducting interviews with students as we continue to finalise subject selections for 2023. In terms of the process, we are now working through Distance Education applications for students studying courses not offered at St Mary's. Ms Finlay also continues to work through eVET, SBAT and other applications. Final confirmation of subjects and details regarding the Senior Interview process will occur in Term Four, once we have finalised all patterns of study for our students. In the meantime, please do not hesitate to email if you have any concerns or questions.

Year 8 (Year 9 2023) Additional Courses of Study Subject Selections

Year 9 2023 Subject Lines have now been determined and conversations with Year 8 students, for those who have not been able to secure one or more of their main preferences, are currently taking place, with time and attention being paid to the students' needs during this process. As students and parents were made aware at the start of the process, we are able to cater for most students' requests but there are some courses that have not been sustained due to small numbers. Where this has occurred, students have an opportunity to meet and discuss other options. It is anticipated that confirmation of subjects allocated to students will be sent home, if not by the end of term, then before the end of Week 1 Term 4. I thank you for your patience at this time as we work towards a good outcome for all involved.

Year 11 Drama – Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde STC Excursion

Year 11 Drama students, Isobel and Bronte, enjoyed some time in Sydney recently, attending the Sydney Theatre Company's performance of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde at The Roslyn Packer Theatre, Walsh Bay. Travelling down after school we had time to "tread the boards" of Pier 4/5, home to the STC, and other Arts Companies such as Bangarra Dance, Sydney Dance Company and Australian Theatre for Young People. There is something very special about introducing young people to a new "world" and I couldn't think of two more delightful human beings than Bronte and Isobel to share this experience with.

The production itself, a multi-disciplinary performance, blending film and live performance ("Cine-drama") was brilliantly executed and the production has met with excellent reviews. The experience capped off a fantastic year for Bronte and Isobel, who have studied the elements of drama, design and production throughout the year.

- Students believe St Mary's Catholic College is a place that values relationships and to which they attach a strong sense of belonging.
- Parents believe that the College is a caring place with effective and purposeful leadership.

What we did:

- Continued engagement of staff in professional learning focused on embedding effective pedagogy within lessons of longer length.
- Implementation of Learning Walks and Talks with a renewed focus on the six critical questions that provide insight into effective learning and teaching; What are you learning? Why? How are you going? How do you know? How could you improve and where do you go for help? Where to from here?
- Further refinement of the student leadership structure providing for greater clarity of roles and areas of responsibility.

We want all (children/young people) in our schools to thrive and we know that working together, listening, and sharing ideas helps our schools to improve and grow as strong learning and faith communities.
